Keep the 'outing' in Girl Scouting

Scouting can be the best out of doors experience the entire year. Try not to make it an "indoor spot" as soon as the frost comes and the foliage disappears, the girls will surely miss out on some fascinating things! The winter air gives pep to the step, sparkle to the eye and that rosy cheek complexion. Check out branch formations, share with your girls the joys of making the trees their friends all through the year. Look for the book *Trees in* Winter by Annie Huntington and check out the Trees activity tub at Sunspot...perfect for all ages. Identify budded twigs and seed pods, study the different kinds of nuts and other falling winter berries. Do you know a tree by its autumn colors? Now is a great time to study a bird's nest without endangering the lives of any offspring. There are plenty of abandoned nests at this time. Check out the three James River overlooks at Camp Sac...intersection of James River Trail and Pavilion Short Cut, Amy's Overlook at the end of the Mama Stump Trail and at the top of Guill's Hill. This is the perfect time to view the Eagles' nest. Encourage your girls to "work" trails such as picking up sticks and removing small branches, plan a treasure hunt using the description of trees, nests, rocks to guide their way. When the foliage is down a whole new world in the out of doors opens up. Winter cabin camping is So Much Fun! And be amazed by the surroundings at camp this winter.

Who pays in Girl Scouting?

Girl/Parent Volunteer

- Yearly membership to GSUSA (\$32.00 for girls, \$25.00 for adults) \$32 broken down to \$25 for GSUSA and \$7 to Girl Scouts of Virginia Skyline Council
- If a brand new troop member (girl) uniform, insignia and troop number
- Yearly troop dues for girl members about \$25 per year
- Fees for day/resident troop camp such as Camp Sacajawea Adventure Camp this summer
- Fall and Cookie program

Troops pay for

- Material needed for troop's GS program
- Supplies and equipment needed for basic operation
- Required trainings for the registered troop adult such as CPR/First Aid or Outdoor Education (optional)
- Earned pins, patches, badges and insignia awarded by troop and some of the expenses related to outings, programs, trips (Troops earn funds through product sales)

Adult Volunteer pays for

- National membership of \$25 to GSUSA
- Uniform and maintenance
- Transportation and mileage
- Parking and road tolls
- Fees where applicable for trainings or workshop which benefits the volunteer personally

Local community

Provides meeting place

Badges/Field Trips, etc.

Created by leader, parents, troop chaperones and troop assistants – more parental help, the more the girls get to do



Distinction between GS badges and patches

Badges (GSUSA or Council's own) are earned via specific requirements that are usually listed online. These are different shapes per age level (for example: brownie badges are triangle shaped while Junior badges are circle shaped). GS badges are worn on the front of the uniform vest or sash. Patches are for "fun" and are presented for participating in a fun event or activity (for example: if visiting a place on a field trip, you could commemorate this visit with a patch of the place). Patches are worn on the back of the uniform vest or sash. A good source of fun patches is snappylogos.com.

The Torch Award

This award recognizes a Girl Scout who acts as a leader in her community such as her GS community. These are individual awards.

Cadette - Silver Torch Award

To earn this award, a Cadette must:

- 1. Complete one Cadette Leadership Journey
- 2. Serve for one full term in a leadership position at your school, place of worship, library, town council, community center, after school club or a similar organization. For example: School yearbook or assist with event planning for a GS program. The length of your service will depend on the term specified by the organization.



Senior - Silver/Gold Torch Award

To earn this award, a Senior must:

- 1. Complete one Senior Leadership Journey
- 2. Serve for one full term in a leadership position at your school, place of worship, library, town council, community center, after school club or a similar organization. For example: School yearbook editor, co-teach a youth class at your church or serve on a Girl Scout Board, possibly plan a GS event.



Ambassador – Gold Torch Award

To earn this award, an Ambassador must:

- 1. Complete one Ambassador Leadership Journey
- 2. Serve for one full term in a leadership position at your school, place of worship, library, town council, community center, after school club or a similar organization. For example: School yearbook editor, co-teach a youth class at your church or serve on a Girl Scout Board, possibly plan a GS event.



Council Policy A5: Adult participants **attending** a Girl Scout (girl) program, trip, or overnight should be registered Girl Scout members and have a cleared background check on file with GSVSC prior to their participation in these Girl Scout activities.

If asked whether a parent/caregiver must be a registered Girl Scout, the answer is:

Yes. Parents/caregivers must have a membership and cleared background check in order to **(be present)** stay at troop meetings and attend field trips, overnights, campouts, cookie booths, or other travel experiences, etc. —*even when adults are not participating in the actual activities*.







Service Unit Program Events

A Service Unit Program Event is a program event planned and carried out by volunteers that provides activities for girls beyond the scope of regular troop activities and includes one or more of the following:

- Participation open to troops/groups within one specific service unit and publicized via service unit-specific social media groups or Rallies.
- Participation includes 3 troops or more
- Participation may also be open to individually registered girl members (Juliettes) within a specific service unit
- Involves pre-registration through <u>Rallyhood</u> or another council-approved site/method
- Involves creating a budget and collecting funds
- Program activities may include the GSLE (girl-led, hands-on, cooperative learning experiences)
- Program activities include one or more of the National Program Pillars
- Program activities may include earning a badge or journey



Council-Wide Program Events

A Council Program Event is a program event that can be planned and carried out by staff or volunteers, and provides activities for girls beyond the scope of regular troop or service unit activities and includes one or more of the following:

- Participation open to more than one more specific service unit and is publicized council-wide (GSVSC Event Calendar & Social Media platforms, etc.)
- Participation is open to troops council-wide
- Participation may be be open to individually registered girl members (Juliettes)
- Involves pre-registration through gsEvents (GSUSA Registration System)
- Involves creating a budget and collecting funds
- May have additional complicated logistics
- Program activities include the GSLE (girl-led, hands-on, cooperative learning experiences)
- Program activities include one or more of the National Program Pillars
- Program activities may include earning a badge or journey



Event Director and/or Trip Leader Key Responsibilities are to:

- Be present **ON SITE** for the entirety of the event or trip.
- Do their best to ensure the event or travel experience of all participants is positive.
- Oversee the health, safety, and well being of every participant.
- Develop and implement a Emergency Action Plan (EAP) applicable to the event. Share EAP with all participants at the start of event.
- Manage all unexpected issues, conflicts, emergencies, or crises as they pop up.

NOTE: The Event Director or Trip Leader MAY NOT be the First Aider.



Service Unit & Council Event Approval Timelines:

- 2 months prior to the event date (repeated events)
- 4-6 months prior to event date for first-time small/simple (one day) events and events requiring vendor approval
- 6-12 months prior to the event date for large/complex (overnight) events or events that include a domestic travel experience (three overnights or more.)
- 12–24 months prior to events that involve international travel.

Vendor approvals are based on Safety Activity Checkpoints (SACs) and require 8-10 weeks to hear back from the vendor for insurance compliance.



PROGRAM EVENT PLANNING TRAINING REQUIREMENTS:

- For day-only service unit events, Event Director must complete GS 107
 Service Unit Program Event Planning
- For council-wide events, Event Director must complete GS 106 Council Program Event Planning.
- For overnight events, Event Director must complete GS 106 Council Program Event Planning and GS 201 Trips & Overnights.
- For events involving camping, in addition to GS 106 Council Program Event Planning, the Event Director must also complete GS 301A Outdoor Education Planning and GS 301B Outdoor Education Overnight as well as one adult from each troop or group participating.

(Outdoor Education training is required before troops, groups, or programming involving individually registered Girl Scouts can include cookouts, campouts, and adventuring out activities that involve: packing gear, platform/cabinette/tent camping, building campfires, and cooking outdoors over a campfire or fire pit, portable stove or grill for any daytime or overnight outdoor camping activity. There must always be a trained Outdoor Ed. Adult per campfire circle/fire pit. There must always be at least one trained Outdoor Ed. Adult for every two portable stoves and/or grills.)

Additional Outdoor Ed. trained volunteers may be needed based on planned outdoor activities, and if including Juliettes.



PROGRAM EVENT PLANNING TRAINING REQUIREMENTS CONT'D:

- For events involving domestic travel, Trip Leader must complete GS 106
 Council Program Event Planning and GS 201 Trips & Overnights.
- For events involving international travel, Trip Leader must complete GS 106
 Council Program Event Planning, GS 201 Trips and Overnights, and GS 203
 International Trip Training.
- If an event involves serving food to the general public that must be kept hot or cold, ServSafe training may be required. Event Director must contact their local health department for specific training requirements.


