Highest Awards

Your project is the solution to the problem you have identified. It's about exploring/visiting communities, finding/identifying an unmet need, then designing a project to fill that need.

Periodically check the GSVSC website calendar for highest award training dates.

Bronze Award

- Highest award earned by a Junior Girl Scout, 4th and 5th grades
- Must complete a Junior Journey before starting the project
- Each Junior and her advisor must complete a virtual or in person training provided by GSVSC
- Project does not require pre-approval by GSVSC unless you plan to create/build on Council property
- Minimum project hours 20 per girl, 40% planning hours and 60% on actual project
- Project focus is something that the girls care about and what they want to improve/fix within a specific community
- Juniors develop an understanding of sustainability and implement this into their Bronze Award project so there is a lasting effect
- Final report submitted online by the team's advisor using form #2752. The
 deadline to complete the final report by a graduating 5th grader is September 15th
 of their 6th grade year.



Silver Award

- Highest Award earned by a Cadette Girl Scout, 6th an 7th and 8th grades
- Must complete a Cadette Journey before starting project
- Each Cadette and her advisor are required to complete a 2-hour training workshop either virtual or in person provided by GSVSC
- Cadettes may work as a small group of 2-4 girls or solo
- Teams advisor must be a registered Girl Scout
- Silver Award project requires pre-approval by GSVSC use form #2732
- Minimum project hours per girl is 50 30% planning hours, 70% on actual project
- Project focus is something that girls care about and what they can do to improve/fix a problem or issue in a specific community
- Project must include sustainability
- Final report is submitted online by each individual girl, even if this is a group project, using form #2733
- The deadline to complete the final report by a graduating 8th grader is September 15th of their 9th grade year.
- Earning the Silver Award is a great springboard toward the Gold Award



Gold Award

- Highest Award earned by a Senior/Ambassador Girl Scout, 9th, 10th, 11th or 12th grade
- Must complete two grade level Journeys or earn the Silver Award and complete one Journey
- Projects are individual/girl led
- Pre-approval of project proposal is required by GSVSC
- Gold Award training is required
- Minimal project hours is 80 hours, 20% planning and 80% project hours
- Gold Award project must include provision to insure sustainability
- Final report is submitted online
- Council guide on <u>www.gsvsc.org</u> "go Gold"



Triumph Award



For those girls within GSVSC who have earned all three highest awards (Bronze, Silver and Gold), they can apply to receive the Triumph Award (#2607). Triumph Award recipients are honored by GSVSC with a lifetime membership.


